Committee Reports

Fall Fest (Janis Kundmueller) – sold water, Gatorade, and chips by the car show. We could not sell pop and water by the Kiwanis Pavilion as in prior years because another group signed up for it. Even though the weather was nice, the car show was not as well attended as the prior year (less than half of parking lot full compared to full parking lot in prior year with overflow into adjacent lot). Profits were \$139. There were a lot of groups selling food and beverage items. In the future, it's probably not worth having a booth unless we can sell pop & water at the Kiwanis Pavilion. Also, consider the number of other groups selling competing items.

Membership (Chris Grande) – Dr. Schatt needs list of members 2 weeks prior to concert to include in program; need to post membership information on Facebook as a reminder to those families who haven't signed up yet; may distribute membership forms to alumni at alumni meeting Volunteer (Barb Mowrer) – have 8 of 9 volunteers needed for basketball concession stand on Sunday, October 18th; 1 or 2 volunteers are needed to collect money and food donations at Sounds of the Stadium on Nov. 1st – Chris Grande and Janis Kundmueller will collect since they will have a table at the event for membership; volunteers are needed for fitting tuxes and dresses for concert band – no date yet, but Barb will send an e-mail to ask for volunteers when the dates are set

Halftime Snacks (Mary Dolansky, Diana Manocchio) – only need snacks for IHS band members this week because Richmond Hts. doesn't have a band; snacks will be Wendy's \$1 chicken sandwiches; will also have a few vegetarian subs from Subway; thanks to the Fleming family for donating use of their tent (and setting it up) for Homecoming Weekend (tents from the city were not available that day); thanks to the Londrico family for donating fruits and vegetables for snacks

Fox 8 – thank you to all of the parents that provided bakery; students were also fed sandwiches, chips, and water when they returned to IHS
